## Esthetics in Implant Dentistry

This presentation will highlight restorative, gingival plastic, and implant surgical considerations in a multidisciplinary approach to treat a maxillary anterior esthetic case. A systematic approach to esthetic evaluation of dentitions, soft, and hard tissue will be outlined.

Selection criteria for an appropriate root coverage technique, ridge augmentation procedure, and implant surgical approach will be schematized. Incision design, flap management, and implant placement with concurrent soft and hard tissues grafting will be shown and described with **slides** and **video**. Rational for use of different bone graft materials and membranes will be explained. Restorative management and provisionalization for the patient comfort will also be described.

The literature and biological rationale for the treatment modalities used will be presented.

Dr. Han received his DDS in 1982, Certificate in Periodontics in 1984, and MS in Oral Biology in 1985, all from UCLA. He has been a Diplomate of American Board of Periodontology since 1992, and he is on the list of American Academy of Periodontology recommended speakers. Dr. Han has published extensively in scientific journals and text books, and he has lectured widely both in the United States, Canada, South America, Europe and Asia. As an Adjunct Professor in the Department of Periodontics, he is responsible for surgical training of the graduate residents in dental implantology and periodontics. He is a Fellow of the American College of Dentist, and he has maintained a private practice limited to implant surgery and periodontics since 1984.
