Uveodermatologic Syndrome (Vogt-Koyanagi-Harada-like Syndrome) Concurrent with Panniculitis in a Miniature Poodle Dog

Signalment: A 5-year-old, intact female miniature Poodle was presented with a history of bilateral visual impairment, poliosis, depigmentation, and left sided head tilt.

Results: Ocular discharge, corneal neovascularization, conjunctival hyperemia, visual impairment, facial poliosis, depigmentation of muzzle, eyelid and perioral regions with diffuse papulonodular lesions in the dorsum were noted on physical examination. A presumptive diagnosis of uveodermatologic syndrome was made.

Uveodermatologic syndrome was confirmed from histopathologic examination of the muzzle, perioral lesion and ocular tissue. Skin biopsy of dorsal lesion revealed panniculitis.

Clinical Relevance: This report shows the first case of uveodermatologic syndrome in a miniature Poodle dog. Concurrent panniculitis was also developed. Uveodermatologic syndrome should be included in differential diagnosis of panniculitis.
